Queenborough Fishery Trust awards grant to ‘A Year in the Life of Sheppey’

The trustees of the Queenborough Fishery Trust have confirmed their support for the community project ‘A Year in the Life of Sheppey’ with a grant of £2,000.

The Trust believes that this award will help Kent Creative Arts bring benefit to the local residents of the Isle of Sheppey, organising a community photographic project on the island. ‘A Year in the Life of Sheppey’ is about involving participants in an active way, giving them the opportunity to pay tribute to the area they live in through photography.

This award adds onto the support offered to the project by Swale Borough Council and sponsors.

A Year in the Life is an art and heritage community project designed to record a year in the life of Canterbury/Faversham/Sheppey during the course of 2011 through 365 photographs, one for each day of the year, taken by the residents. This unique project, which has been hugely successful in Faversham last September, will show the different views, styles and feelings that each photographer brings in, with photographs featuring people, events, places etc that are around them. 200 people are taking part so far...
